### Grant Coordinators

Grant coordinators are staff members around campus that work directly with faculty, providing pre- and post-award assistance on contracts and grants. Many departments, centers, and institutes have staff that while "grant coordinator" isn't their official title, it is one of the functions of their job. Grant coordinators receive regular updates from the Office of Sponsored Programs Administration (OSPA), and have the most up-to-date information about grant submission and management. PIs who involve a grant coordinator early on in the development of a grant proposal, will save considerable time and effort.
